Over the next three years, Western's Rocky Mountain Region expects to recruit employees for the following positions:

## Information Technology Specialist

Manages, leads, administers, develops, delivers or supports information technology systems and services used in the automated acquisition, storage, manipulation, management, movement, control, display, switching, interchange, transmission, assurance or reception of information. Information technology includes computers, network components, peripheral equipment, software, firmware, services and related sources.

## Public Utility Specialist

Develops, conducts and reviews power repayment and rate design studies, special power marketing surveys and resource studies. Develops and implements data processing applications to be used for power marketing studies and reports. Develops, coordinates, implements and administers marketing programs and contracts to carry out marketing policy and procedures.

## Contract Specialist

Procures and administers contracts for supplies, equipment, services, construction and/or architect-engineering services. Items range from common use to technical and specialized items.

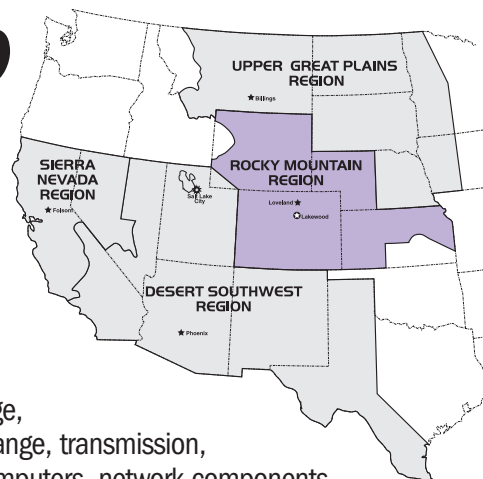
## Electrical Engineer

Designs substations and transmission lines. Writes equipment specifications. Prepares alternating current and direct current schematic diagrams. Plans new transmission facilities and conduct studies associated with all phases of the power system. Designs supervisory control and data acquisition systems. Designs other communications systems and develops standards for system control and security of transmission facilities.

## Accountant

Tracks expenditures and revenues. Controls funds and costs. Maintains and analyzes accounts and accounting records to assure that expenditures do not exceed budget line items. Assesses the financial impact of proposed legislation. Develops and maintains financial information systems. Assures timely reporting of financial status and makes financial decisions affecting power rates charged to purchasers of Western power.
